	<b>Produce classes</b>	

All fruit and vegetables should be home grown - in your garden or allotment.

Aim for uniformity in size, length and appearance.

\*Display small vegetables on a white (paper) plate.

1	Three Potatoes*	Any variety. Select medium sized tubers with shallow eyes. Should be free from skin blemishes.
2	Three Onions*	Well-ripened bulbs of good colour. Avoid removing too much skin. Tie tops with uncoloured raffia or string. Trim roots. Sit onions on dry sand.
3	Three Climbing Beans	Select straight tender pods of even length and good colour with no sign of seeds. Exhibit with stalk intact.
4	Three Beetroot*	Select uniform size, not too large, (between 5 and 7cm) with smooth skin and retain tap root.
5	Three Carrots*	Select full length roots of good shape, colour and size - free from side shoots and from green at the crown.
6	Five Tomatoes*	Select ripe but firm richly coloured fruit, stalks intact. Stage on plate with stalk uppermost.
7	Longest Runner Bean	The 'longer the better'! Display as it is.
8	Three Courgettes	Select young, tender uniform fruit of 10-20cm in length. Display flat, with or without flower still attached.
9	One Cucumber	Select a fresh, young, straight fruit of uniform thickness, a short stem and flower attached if possible.
10	Another Vegetable	- one that is not mentioned above ( a single specimen or a group of up to 3)
11	Three English Cooking Apples*	Select large, solid unblemished fruits, stalks intact. Display on a white plate, stalk end downwards,
12	Three English Dessert Apples*	Select solid unblemished fruits, stalks intact. Display on a white plate, stalk end downwards,
13	Three Pears*	As for apples, except that best arranged around the perimeter of a plate with stalks towards the centre.
14	Collection of herbs in a small container	Display cut herbs from the garden in a suitable small vase or container.
15	Collection of home grown fruit and vegetables	Display in a suitable container - e.g. a box or trug. Container not to exceed 18"x12"/46cm x 30cm overall

	<b>Flower Classes</b>	

**In classes 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20 use only flowers from your garden or allotment.**

**Bought flowers may be used in classes 21, 22, 23 and 24.**

<b>16</b>	Three Dahlias	Select clean blooms with florets intact, firm and free from blemish. Stems should be straight and proportionate to the size of the blooms. Stage with blooms all facing in the same direction, not touching and with balanced effect. Retain some foliage on the stems if possible.
<b>17</b>	One Spiked Gladioli (large flowering)	Select a straight, well balanced spike still carrying bottom floret. Remove secondary spikes. Display in a simple vase.
<b>18</b>	One Rose any variety	Select a bloom with a well-formed centre, free from blemishes and with a strong stem and healthy leaves. Display in a simple vase.
<b>19</b>	One specimen single bloom - any variety	Any single bloom from your garden in a vase that complements its appeal.
<b>20</b>	A Flower floating in a glass	Pick a flower from the garden that will float in a small glass of water.
<b>21</b>	Exhibit - Arrangement of Buddleia	Use fresh flowers and foliage with or without accessories in a suitable container to create a stunning display. Maximum size 15"x15" / 38cmx38cm Height unlimited
<b>22</b>	Arrangement of Silk or Dried Flowers	Arrange flowers and natural foliage in stunning display! Maximum size 15"x15" / 38x38cm. Height unlimited.
<b>23</b>	An Arrangement in an Eggcup	Create a cracking display of flowers and greenery in an eggcup.
<b>24</b>	Basket of seasonal flowers and foliage	Create a stunning display using flowers and greenery. Maximum size 15"x15" / 38x38cm. Height unlimited.

<b>27</b>	A Scarecrow	Be creative! This can be an individual or family effort. To be displayed outside (on the field).
<b>28</b>	Recycle a Milk Container	What can you do with an empty milk container (plastic bottle or wax carton)? Turn it into something useful or a piece of artwork!
<b>29</b>	Make a Pin Cushion	Show us all what you can do! (Any medium)
<b>30</b>	Make a Butterfly	Any medium. Maximum size 30cm

31	Jar of soft fruit jam	The flavour, consistency and colour of jam, marmalade and chutneys will be judged. Use any shaped, clean jar. Seal with a wax disc and cellophane/lid. Labels should only state the contents and the date of making.
32	Jar of fruit marmalade	
33	Jar of homemade chutney	
34	A Homemade Quiche	Home-bake, to any recipe, a tasty savoury egg custard in a pastry pie crust.
35	A Coffee and Walnut Cake	Use a small cake tin to bake a gloriously moist cake that will create a buzz at the tea table!
36	A Tea Loaf	Try making this traditional teatime favourite
37	Three Chocolate Muffins	Use a basic muffin recipe for this classic treat for chocoholics
38	Five Shortbread Biscuits	We are looking for uniformity in size, shape and colour in this Scottish treat. Keep it plain and simple.

<b>44</b>	Bake: Decorate a Digestive Biscuit with a Butterfly	Turn a plain biscuit into a tasty edible work of art. You could use coloured icing, marzipan, sweets ....
<b>45</b>	Grow: Vegetable Creature	Turn an ordinary vegetable into an amazing creature!
<b>46</b>	Show: A photograph taken by entrant: 'Something that Flies'	Photograph something that flies - it may be a butterfly, a bird or something manmade! Display unmounted. Max. size 8"x10"/20cmx26cm

<b>48</b>	Bake: Three Butterfly Cakes	Use a simple sponge mix and butter icing. Display them on a small (paper) plate.
<b>49</b>	Grow: Vegetable Creature	Turn an ordinary vegetable into an amazing creature!
<b>50</b>	Show: A photograph taken by entrant: 'Something that Flies'	Photograph something that flies - it may be a butterfly, a bird or something manmade. Display unmounted. Max. size 8"x10"/20cmx26cm
